Visions of Japan - Kawase Hasui 2004

Following on the success of the catalogue raisonné a "Kawase Hasui: The Complete Woodblock Prints" a published by Hotei Publishing in 2003, "Visions of Japan: Kawase Hasui (TM)s Masterpieces" brings together in a single volume one hundred of the artist's most celebrated prints. Fully illustrated, this publication

includes annotated descriptions for each work, as well as two essays on Hasui (TM)s life and work by Dr. Kendall H. Brown. Kawase Hasui (1883-1957) is considered the foremost Japanese landscape print artist of the 20th century, and he is most closely associated with the pioneering Shin-hanga ('New Prints') publisher Watanabe Shōzaburō (1885-1962). Hasui (TM)s work became hugely popular, not only in his native Japan but also in the West, especially in the United States. His valuable contribution to the woodblock print medium was acknowledged in 1956, a year before his death, when he was honoured with the distinction of a Living National Treasure (TM).

Their goal is to spread conservation and climate change ideas far beyond native plant and nature lovers, and to plant the seeds to foster action. Lands we all own, lands under constant threat of development or resource extraction, impacts of global warming, sea level rise and wildfires. An unprecedented and eye-opening examination of the early career of one of America's most celebrated photographers One of the most influential photographers of his

generation, Ansel Adams (1902-1984) is famous for his dramatic photographs of the American West. Although many of Adams's images are now iconic, his early work has remained largely unknown. In this first monograph dedicated to the beginnings of Adams's career, Rebecca A. Senf argues that these early photographs are crucial to understanding Adams's artistic development and offer new insights into many aspects of the artist's mature oeuvre. Drawing on copious archival research, Senf traces the first three decades of Adams's photographic practice—beginning with an amateur album made during his childhood and culminating with his Guggenheim-supported National Parks photography of the 1940s. Highlighting the artist's persistence in forging a career path and his remarkable ability to learn from experience as he sharpened his image-making skills, this beautifully illustrated volume also looks at the significance of the artist's environmentalism, including

his involvement with the Sierra Club.
